Call to Order and Introductions –Larkspur Mayor, Gerry Been called the meeting to order at 7:30 a.m.

Jurisdictional Updates

Susan Squyer, Mayor Pro-Tem, Lone Tree - welcomed the group at 7:30 a.m. and had everyone introduce themselves.

City of Lone Tree: Cathie Brunnick reported

- Economic activities are booming in Lone Tree and we have joined Transportation for Americas Smart Cities collaboration to tackle urban mobility challenges
- Michael Anderson is our new Council member.

City of Castle Pines: Tara Radloff reported

- the City is establishing its presence and signs are being installed on major roadways and at exits
- Hess Road is being renamed
- An election question to become home rule will be on the ballot in November
- Instituting more creative planning to engage residents

Town of Castle Rock: Dave Corliss reported

- The April election resulted in two changes: the Town charter changed Castle Rock from 7 district to 6 and a mayor at large will be elected. All other council seats remain in place

- The Council received a briefing on first quarter business and it was favorable
- The Fire Department Chief retired and we are looking for his replacement
- Next month is our Wise Water Connection in Castle Rock and the Council approved an IGA with Dominion Water which should be in place by 2020.
- Festival Park will be formally dedicated next month.

Douglas County: Roger Partridge reported

- There have been changes in Commissioners. Dave Weaver is now a Federal Marshall and Diane Holbert was appointed as Commissioner to complete Dave Weaver's term. The primary election will be held on June 26th to determine who will be on the ballot in November.
- I-25 construction is scheduled to begin August 1st beginning with the first 6-mile section immediately south of Castle Rock. Target for completion of I-25 changes is 2021.
- This is the 100th year of the Douglas County Fair and Rodeo and we have a 22-member volunteer workforce standing by to help this year. Cody Johnson will be one of the headliners and he sold out in Texas. In addition to the fair and rodeo, there will be many 4-H activities and a chuckwagon judging contest.

Douglas County Libraries: Bob Pasicznyuk reported

- DCL is working with high school students who did not graduate because of reading problems. An incentive of \$250 is being offered for those students who register or might register for school.

Highlands Ranch Metro District: Vicky Starkey reported

- A South Metro board was elected in January
- An architect was hired to design a fire station at Summit View and Wildcat
- Board members were re-elected with no changes from the previous Board

Town of Larkspur: Matt Krimmer reported

- We continue to work with the I-25 Gap coalition since we will be the last entity affected. We have 3 bridges which need to be replaced in Larkspur and the Town is concerned the bridgework will cause major traffic re-routing
- Our annual Renaissance fair opens June 16, 2018 and will be ongoing each Saturday and Sunday for eight consecutive weekends
- Our Music in the Park on Friday evenings has grown to 6 nights—the first to be June 8 followed by June 22. The music is varied and entertainment is free. See our website for details. Food vendors will be on site.

Town of Parker: Joshua Rivero reported

- Parker police department is hosting a medical drug pickup for prescription drugs and medical waste no longer needed by residents
- Police department is compiling a map of hotspots i.e., speeders in special school zones and other danger areas and keeping the community engaged in reporting these areas
