Call to Order and Introductions: Larkspur Mayor, Gerry Been called for a moment of silence to honor fallen Deputy, Zachari Parrish. Mayor Mike Waid welcomed the group to Parker.

### Jurisdictional Updates:

City of Castle Pines: Tera Radloff reported:

- City Manager announced his resignation and hiring process has been instituted

Town of Castle Rock: George Teal reported:

- The Town was able to manage water demands during this dry spell using resources from Plum Creek rather than dipping into Denver or Arapahoe Basin.
- Another well is being drilled in Sterling Ranch
- Reviewing animal codes for new and existing construction
- Horizontal blue lights added to Star to honor fallen officers

Douglas County: Coimmissioner Dave Weaver reported:

- The County wants to put \$150 million back into roads but wants to work on changing driver mentality- there are five bills going to the Capitol related to the increased traffic death toll
- Sandstone Ranch was purchased and is now part of the Open Space program

Douglas County Libraries: Sharon Nemechik reported:

- Preparing a new vision statement for the libraries
- Douglas County Libraries were recently voted the populations #2 attraction

Douglas County School District: David Ray reported:

- As the newly appointed school Board President he has two major goals: 1) fill the School District Superintendent position and 2) Address the wage problem for Douglas County teachers

Highlands Ranch Metro District: Vicky Starkey reported:

- There are two ballots being voted on 1) fire services and 2) elect new members for Board of Directors for the Metro District

Town of Larkspur: Matt Krimmer reported:

- New water treatment plant to be completed June or July 2018
- Jellystone Campground under new management and will go from 149 to 525 camping sites
- Increased traffic going through Larkspur and its effect on emergency services is being addressed with CDOT
- In process of developing 8 Acres for senior housing
- Larkspur will fill two term-limited Council seats in the April election

City of Lone Tree: Cathie Brunnick reported:

- The Art Center had a successful season

Town of Parker: Debbie Lewis reported:

- Commercial development of 132,000 s.f. in the Parker Mall is ongoing
- Princess Ball coming up January 26<sup>th</sup> at Pace Center, dancing, refreshments and special visitor
- Discovery Park is now open
- Reminder that Parker Days featured guest will be Trace Atkins
